I also would like to know who "they" in Michelle's message is referring to.
Message:

Following up regarding your request for a special meeting. I did reach out to the mayor and commissioners. Unfortunately, I did not receive a quorum in agreement to schedule this special meeting.

I know that *they* did stress that they felt that in Monday's commission meeting *they* gave staff the direction *they* needed to move ahead therefore *they* did not feel the need that another meeting needed to be held.

Additionally, I would like to know if Larry believes that it is defensible for Jeff/George to reject all new restaurant requests for permits due to the fact that we have "legislation in process." Obviously, it will take considerable time for the ordinance to be processed through the boards and return to the Commission. Not to mention that this definition should be given careful collective thought before drafting and returning to boards.

Also, I would like to know if you plan to direct staff to reject new restaurant requests between now and ordinance adoption.
